Current meeting procedure is Robert's Rules of Order, which specifies that physical presence is the basis for a quorum unless otherwise specified Hypothetical General Council meeting for elections including absentee balloting, would need significant amount (300-400+) of votes made in order for election to be valid/certifiable Discussion regarding a hypothetical Business Committee (BC) where 4 officers are legally removed through Constitution Article X – Removal of Officers, and if then no BC quorum could be made, possible scenarios include If the Business Committee or Election Committee invalidates an election due to protest If an election dispute is filed against a newly elected BC member that prevents them taking office and the ability to make quorum
