	• 2 email requests have been made by our Chairperson to the Secretary-Treasurer for the October 15, 1990 version of the Constitution and By-Laws, no replies have been received  • While there is no time limit associated with Secretary-Treasurer duties to provide documents upon request, this can be an issue for Committees or individuals requesting documents for the continuation of their work  • Duties state "in presence" of Secretary-Treasurer for review, this has been the sticking point for tribal member access to Resolutions for the codification of laws	

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	<ul> <li>There is a Business Committee Resolution for a Special Meeting of the General Council on November 8, 2025 however the Chief has not called Special Meeting and there are vocalizations from tribal members about the constitutionality of aforementioned Resolution         <ul> <li>Debate centers around By-Laws Article III Section II which requires "the majority of Business Committee" to call for a Special Meeting</li> <li>At the original meeting where the Business Committee passed the Resolution the majority of Business Committee members present passed this Resolution, however that was 3 out of 5 voting members who were present. Some tribal members believe it should be 4 members out of 7 to vote for a Special Meeting of the General Council call-out to be valid, per By-Laws Article III Section II</li> </ul> </li> <li>Liaison for the Business Committee Curt Lawrence notified Secretary that he will not be present at tonight's meeting</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Constitution Committee member discusses Regular Elections</li> <li>Constitution Committee member states that it is important to address the discrepancy the Election Committee brought forward regarding Constitution Article VIII which states "Regular elections of the Business Committee" are what's covered under a Business Committee-prescribed Election Ordinance</li> <li>Another Constitution Committee member states that Constitution Article VIII states that "Election of officers will also be held at such Annual Meetings."         <ul> <li>This has limited General Council participation in elections in prior years when quorum could not be met to hold an Annual Meeting</li> <li>A possible solution is to divorce the elections from the Annual Meeting, this was done in 2025 when the Annual Meeting election was in dispute but there have been tribal member calls to review the constitutionality of an election done outside of an Annual Meeting per Constitution Article VIII</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

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	<ul> <li>A third Constitution Committee member states they believe that separating Elections from Meetings is a viable solution to making sure that elections happen regularly and General Council members can vote for elected officers ONLY if mail-in voting is available for all General Council members regardless of location.</li> <li>Constitution Committee member suggests language of "Elections happen in conjunction with Annual Meetings."</li> <li>Matter is currently not within scope of initial potential amendments identified by Constitution Committee but should be addressed in future revision rounds</li> </ul>	
	Constitution Committee reviews Initial Advisory Report and begins drafting session. Top level bullet points are chronological, some subjects were combined for ease of reading.  • Members agree to address Constitution Article VII currently titled Standing Committees  • Most, if not all, elected Standing Committees should have 5 members  • Debate over keeping Standing Committees structure and each Section listing a Standing Committee  • Staggering of terms is necessary to note  • Elected Standing Committee members should be subject to Grievances and potential removal  • Alternates may need to be established  • Constitution Committee member expresses concerns that focus on specific minutiae may make the Constitution too long to be understood as intended, the longer it is the more arguments over interpretations that can be made  • Different Constitution Committee member states that we can alleviate misinterpretations by having tribal members who are not involved in tribal government to proofread and walk-through any finished drafts before releasing them  • Constitution Committee continues drafting	

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	Constitution Article VII currently titled Standing Committees  Subcommittees may not necessary to be named in a new draft but the structure and creation of them should be  Numbers can be reserved for future Standing Committees  Current Standing Committees include Grievance, Credit, Welfare, Education  Current benefits structure called Welfare Committee comes from formerly named Claims Committee structure which was established by the General Council to oversee court settlements and how those monies were disbursed  Need to add Election Committee to Standing Committees  Enrollment Committee needs to be included  Ethics Committee is debated by Constitution Committee to be included under Standing Committees  One Committee member does not see a functional difference between the Ethics and Grievance Committees  One Committee member states that Ethics Committee could write policy but it's pointed out that the current Ethics Committee tried to do as much and was not able to galvanize forces to do that  Housing and Constitution Committees come up later in the discussion and are determined to be more akin to subcommittees than Standing Committees than Standing Committees that can be created by the Business Committee and/or General Council  Grievance Committee is the one check that

	<ul> <li>All Standing Committees except for Enrollment will have 5 members</li> <li>Business Committee is not a Standing Committee by definition as it is created by a different Article</li> <li>Possible language of "election of Standing Committee officers may be held in conjunction with any Regular or Special Meeting of the General Council"         <ul> <li>Committee debates on holding Elections outside of General Council Meetings as previous Elections have been called off due to not meeting quorum</li> <li>Committee member states they are only OK with such a provision if mailed-in ballots are used for a given Election that does not require a Meeting of the General Council</li> <li>Committee continues debate later on, but does not come to concrete conclusion, past history and potential abuse of power is explored with the idea of divorcing Elections from General Council Meetings</li> </ul> </li> <li>Committeeperson proposes idea of 5 Standing Committee members and 2 alternates, the purposes of alternates being to replace Committee members who have to recuse themselves or are removed in a given matter         <ul> <li>Debate over language of alternates is addressed later on in drafting – only certain</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
