place  The head of the Finance Department has been requested to meet with the Business Committee and has confirmed that she would do so, but the Secretary-Treasurer has not put this meeting on the agenda nor the Business Committee Resolutions for funding out of Tribal Operations  Secretary-Treasurer still has not responded to a document request by a Constitution Committee member for 2025 General Council Resolutions that includes a General Council Resolution that creates this Constitution Committee  Constitution Committee  Constitution Committee funding is through General Council Welfare Fund per the original 2025 General Council Resolution creating this Committee  Business Committee member present confirms that no General Council Welfare Fund monies have been touched  Constitution Committee member clarifies that Constitution Committee stipends are being paid without budgets in place, however the Grievance and Election Committees who have each met with us one time in their official capacities have not been paid a stipend for those meetings as Constitution Committee has requested  Election Committees should be paid out of FY2025 budget and Grievance Committee should be paid out of FY2025 budget and Grievance Committee should be paid out of FY2026 budget, both of which were submitted weeks ago  Business Committee member present clarifies that they are allowed to request an item be put on the agenda, but their request is just that, a request  Sometimes Chief will ask if there is any other business to be addressed but this is not always the case  Business Committee has discussed budgets every week since late August  Business Committee's next monthly meeting is on Wednesday (Veteran's Day holiday was day before and monthly meeting was moved 1 week out from Constitutional mandate)

	Constitution Committee discussion on amendment drafting continues. For ease of reading some items have been combined, but all top-level bullet points are in chronological order.	
	Grievance process is discussed as a mechanism for making sure that Committees are working and doing the work they are required to do  Ethics violations would fall under the Grievance process  Suggestion made that the investigative body for Grievances may need to be separated from the Grievance Committee who makes determinations on Grievances as a check and balance on the process; different Constitution Committee member counters that the hypothetical subpoena power would allow General Council members to investigate  Judicial systems are discussed – currently we are not in a place to establish an entire judicial system via Constitution however the possibility for establishing judicial authority is possible in this current series of amendment drafts  Current plans for intertribal consortium are held up until the 2 cases involving requests for the reestablishment of our reservation jurisdiction, we need to have the judicial order that reestablishes the reservation ARPA monies are allocated to the development of a tribal consortium  Structure of Government article determined as an appropriate place for mentions of judicial authority and/or codification of laws  Later on Constitution Committee drafts and agrees on amendment wording that requires ratification by a General Council for the introduction or modification of judicial or

	Secretary and Treasurer duties in By-Laws Article I begin to be drafted  Important to use language allowing use of technological methods available  Important for these matters to be accurately tracked  Finance Department currently handles majority of financial transactions for operation of the Nation, Treasurer position is oversight for all financial matters and should be able to understand and provide a comprehensive picture of the Nation's finances, including possibly enterprises  It is important to establish rules for confidentiality and policies like the personnel policies that currently govern Finance Department designees  Due to the fluctuation in roles and responsibilities of Secretary-Treasurer over the past 90+ years, it is important to write new Treasurer duties in such a way where the Treasurer position is not constrained to one specific situation of funding or tribal government structure does, the duties need to be flexible to meet the needs and resources of our tribal government at any given time  Need for designated agent provision in the event a Treasurer is unavailable to receive tribal monies  Present policy is that all BC members are check signers and the paperwork for that authorization is done at the beginning of their term, the check signing process has multiple levels of approval and requires 3 signatures for large check amounts

TIME	combined, but all top-level bullet points are in chronological order.  • Grievance process discussed, it's stated that Grievances may only be addressed by a Grievance Committee, but they have the right to refer crimes for outside prosecution  • Duties of Treasurer office discussion begins again — questions asked about contingency plans for bank account logins and other financial information if the Secretary-Treasurer is incapacitated  • Business Committee member clarifies that the bank requires Business Committee Resolutions to alter tribal officials' access to tribal accounts in their bank or do things such as check signing or receiving a login for online banking  • In the interim when there was a vacancy of the Secretary-Treasurer's office then the head of the Finance Department was given access to banking information via this method  • Future Tribal Legislative Hierarchy section can outline Business Committee Resolution topics including but not limited to financial authorizations etc.  • There have been issues where former elected officials were still on accounts despite a BC Resolution having been given to the bank to take those officials off tribal accounts, the duty of periodic audits of tribal bank accounts including tribal official access to them is a duty best suited for a Treasurer  • Process for Welfare/Claims/Benefits Committee discussed	OWNER
